Why are rivers important?

For this term's homework project, you need to choose a river around the world and complete five of the following hopscotch tasks.

7) Affecting

Imagine you have been on a day trip to your chosen river. Write a recount about your day including what you have seen and done.

8) Evaluating

Make a list of key rules that you think people need to follow in order to protect the future of your chosen river.

5) Analysing

Research data relating to this river and create a graph to show what you have found out. (eg. depth at different times of the year, wildlife) What conclusions can you draw from this data?

6) Creating

Design a creature that is suitably adapted to live in your river and write an information sheet about it for a wildlife park.

Create a model to show how the water cycle works.

What would the consequences be for the community that relies on your chosen river, if it were to dry up completely? Explain your answer fully.

3) Understanding

Create a drawing/diagram of your river, labelling key features including the source and mouth as well as any others such as tributaries.

Find out about the wildlife that inhabits your chosen river and write a report about this. You can include pictures/images as well.

Create a fact file about your chosen river. (Information could include length, depth, where the source is etc.)
