

Curriculum Overview for Year 2 Pupils – Term 4

Theme title: What was it like being a pirate?

Launch pad event: dress up pirate

English <i>Please ensure guided reading books are brought to school daily.</i>	The children will look at a variety of different explanation texts and the features of them. They will learn to organise their writing using sub headings and write in more detail. We will then be looking at the story of The Lighthouse Keeper’s Lunch. We will use adjectives to describe characters and a setting, make predictions and change a story.	
Maths	We will continue to learn our tables and will be using what we have learnt this term in division to find simple fractions of numbers and shapes. We will revisit time learning about o clock and half past, as well as quarter past and quarter to. We will progress to telling the time to the nearest 5 minutes using analogue and digital clocks. We will be using vocabulary such as anti-clockwise and clockwise turns; quarter and half turns to give directions, both written and oral. The children will also practise using a ruler to measure in cm’s.	
Science	The children will identify and name a range of materials. They will suggest why the materials might be used for a specific job. They will explore how shapes can be changed by squashing, bending, twisting and stretching.	<u>Cross-curricular links</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • New vocabulary. • Acting • Sorting and grouping.
Computing	This term the children will use a paint program to create a digital image. They will take photographs and save images digitally. They will then improve and edit digital images, and recognise that digital images can be changed.	
Geography	The children will be naming the world’s oceans and locating them on a map. They will know the continents of the world and where to find them. The children will go on a pirate journey to discover how jobs are different in other locations. They will also make their own tea stained maps to plot a journey.	<u>Cross-curricular links</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> -Labelling -Famous pirates
History	The children will learn about different famous pirates from around the world and what they did. They will learn to use historical vocabulary to describe what has happened in the past. We will be looking at different sources of information that show how life was different.	<u>Cross-curricular links</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> -facts -new vocabulary
Art	The children will explore how clay works and observe how craft makers use clay. They will consider the tools they can use with clay and then cut, roll and coil their own clay to make a pot.	
Design & Tech	The children will look at different moving pictures and explore pushing and pulling sliders. They will design and make their own moving picture to do with the theme of the oceans and pirate ships. They will then evaluate their moving picture and explain how they could improve it.	
PE	Country Dancing - The children will learn a country-dance that involves them dancing in a group and with a partner in time to a song. Hockey – the children will learn skills needed to use a hockey stick confidently. They will be taught how to pass, dribble and block as well as how to score a goal.	
Music	The children will spend the next two terms learning what an ocarina is and how to play one. They will learn what the different musical notations mean and how to play different notes.	
RE	In R.E. the children will continue to learn about what a Christian is and that they believe in God. They will discuss that Christians follow the example of Jesus. They will begin to recognise some Christian symbols and images used to express ideas about God. Children will start to make links between what Jesus taught and what Christians believe and do.	
P.S.H.E	This term we will be talking about the different roles people play in our lives. The different types of families and how they differ to their own. Children will recognise that some things are private and the importance of respecting privacy.
