

Year R Curriculum Overview – Term 1

Theme Title: Who Am I?



Launch Pad: Tour of the school and grounds

Communication	Speaking and listening is an essential part of our curriculum and the children will take part in many		
and Language	activities to enhance these skills. We will provide activities that involve giving children		
	opportunities to experience a rich language environment; to develop their confidence and skills in		
	expressing themselves.		
Personal, Social	Our focus for this term will be to make friends, to share and care and to understand the school		
and Emotional	rules, what is right and wrong and why. To develop self-confidence and become motivated to		
Development	learn. We will also be developing the children's skills to become independent and to use their		
	knowledge of the new routines that they have learnt.		
Physical	We will be learning how to travel, balance and climb safely, showing an awareness of space. We		
Development	will learn to control big toys and wheeled toys safely. The children will also develop skills of		
	throwing, catching and aiming. They will be given opportunities to develop their scissor, tool and		
	pencil skills. Our 'Write Dance' sessions develop large-scale movement, leading to fine motor co-		
	ordination through movement, dance and drawing in response to music.		
Mathematics Children will learn to count, recognise, order and compare numbers. They will learn			
	dice patterns. We will be learning to recognise small amounts without the need for counting. We		
	will learn to make and continue repeating patterns.		
Literacy	The pupils will experience reading through a variety of fiction, poetry and rhymes. They will		
	experiment with mark making and writing in a range of situations. In phonics we will learn to		
	listen to and distinguish different sounds. We will begin to match sounds to letters, following		
	Anima Phonics.		
Understanding the	We will be finding out about ourselves and our own history. We will be investigating our school		
World	environment and draw a simple map of the school. We will be learning about our class name		
	landmarks and discussing seasonal changes in autumn.
