Theme Title: Why Are The Lights Shining?



## Launch Pad: Firework Dance

Communication	The children will be developing their listening and attention skills, in order to respond correctly to	
and Language	instructions which involve several ideas or actions and to be able to answer 'how' and 'why'	
and Language	questions. They will be practising speaking in full sentences that make sense and using a range of

Personal, Social	Children will develop self-confidence and be confident to try new activities and to speak to others	
and Emotional	about their own interests. We will also be developing the pupils' skills to become independent	
Development	and to use their knowledge of the new routines that they have learnt.	
Physical	In our outdoor area, we will be learning how to travel and balance safely, showing an awareness	
Development	of space. The pupils will also develop ball skills, throwing and catching a ball. They will be given	
Development	opportunities to develop their scissor and pencil skills. 'Write Dance' sessions develop large-scal	
	movement, leading to fine motor co-ordination through movement, dance and drawing in	
	response to music.	
Mathematics	Pupils will learn to count, recognise, order and compare numbers beyond 10. They will also learn	
	about the properties of 2d shapes. The children will begin to use the vocabulary of 'more' and	
	'less' to compare amounts. We will be learning to use positional language as well as exploring	
	length and symmetry.	
Literacy	The pupils will experience reading through a variety of fiction, poetry and rhymes. They will	
	experiment with writing in a range of situations. We will continue to teach pupils to recognise,	
	identify, write and link sounds to letters.	
Understanding the	We will be learning about special events such as Bonfire Night, Remembrance Sunday, Diwali and	
World	Christmas. We will be learning about life in India and discussing the similarities and differences	
	between different cultures and ways of life.	
RE	Pupils will learn about a range of celebrations including Diwali, Sukkot, birthdays and Christmas.	
Expressive Arts &	Pupils will learn a range of simple songs and poems to perform. The children will explore making	
Design	pictures on the laptops and will use a range of resources such as clay and tissue paper to make	
	models.	
Our Outdoor	The outdoor classroom has been designed to provide a learning environment that supports all the	
Classroom	above areas of learning. As we learn outside most days, please make sure that your child comes to	
	school with appropriate outdoor clothes – a named sun hat if it is hot, warm, waterproof coat if it	
	is cold or wet. We do have waterproof suits for learning time and a supply of Wellington boots at	
	school that children can borrow.	
Homework	Daily sharing of reading books. Diaries are sent home each weekend for the children to share with	
	their family and for parents/carers and children to add their own news to. The children then share	
	their special times and events with their classmates, thus helping them to appreciate different	
	ways of life.
