	learn to tell the time to o'clock. To begin to count in 2s, 5s and 10s. To use a		
	number line to solve addition questions.		
Literacy	To read and write simple sentences, using some punctuation independently e.g.		
	stops and capital letters. To begin to write daily during our formal English lessons.		
	To begin to remember correct spellings for common words.		
Understanding	To learn about how a farm works and the different jobs on a farm. To compare this		
the World	to what farms used to be like in the past. To learn about the life cycles of both		
	animals and plants. To plant some seeds and understand what they need to survive.		
RE	Pupils will talk about nature and how to look after it. They will learn the Creation		
	story and other important stories from different religions e.g. Islam.		
Expressive Arts	To explore printing using fruit and vegetables. To create farmyard style patterns.		
& Design	To look at and comment on the work of John Constable. To experiment using		
	different materials to make a farmyard collage.		
Our Outdoor	The outdoor classroom has been designed to provide a learning environment that		
Classroom	supports all the above areas of learning. As we learn outside most days, please		
	make sure that your child comes to school with appropriate outdoor clothes - a		
	named sun hat if it is hot and a warm, waterproof coat if it is cold or wet.		
Homework	Daily sharing of guided reading books. These are sent home every day and it is		
	essential that the children practise their reading at home, for a few minutes each		
	day.
