	stops and capital letters. To begin to write daily during our formal English lessons. To		
	begin to remember correct spellings for common words.		
Understanding the	To learn about different roles in society and the different jobs that people have. To		
World	understand the importance of the emergency services and what they can do to help us.		
	To learn about dentists and how to look after our teeth. To compare life in the past to		
	the modern day through stories and nursery rhymes, in particular focusing on jobs.		
RE	Pupils will talk about nature and how to look after it. They will learn the Creation story		
	and other important stories from different religions e.g. Islam.		
PSHE	To understand there are consequences to our actions and to discuss how we can help		
	the environment.		
Expressive Arts &	To comment on famous artwork and give own opinions. To explore how to make		
Design	different colours and shades with paint. To use their imagination in original ways, in art		
	and design, making music and dances and experiment with ways of changing them.		
Our Outdoor	The outdoor classroom has been designed to provide a learning environment that
